

INTERNSHIPS AND CO-OPS

Students interested in gaining real-world work experience should pursue an internship or co-op during their studies at UMass Boston. Internships are usually part-time with flexible hours and typically last one semester. Co-ops are full-time paid positions directly related to your field of study. Co-ops generally last for six months to a year and offer substantive professional work experience.

ON-CAMPUS HOUSING

This is the recommended option for first-year, undergraduate UMass Boston GSSP students. UMass Boston's 260,000-square-foot on-campus residence hall provides beds for first-year domestic and international students. The state-of-the-art building includes fully furnished double, triple and quad rooms, laundry facilities, a community kitchen, study areas and a dining hall.

Housing is not guaranteed for all first-year students and there are a limited number of rooms available. In order for your application to be reviewed, a deposit of US\$300 is required. Entry options to UMass Boston

THE UNDERGRADUATE UMASS BOSTON GSSP

The Undergraduate UMass Boston GSSP is the first year of a bachelor's degree at UMass Boston. This program consists of academic-for-credit courses and skill-development courses and provides a bridge from your high school experience to studying for a university degree in the U.S. Upon successful completion of the Undergraduate UMass Boston GSSP, you will move directly into the second year of your chosen undergraduate degree program.

Program coursework

Program offerings in business, computer science, engineering, arts, social sciences and science include coursework that builds study skills coupled with university courses. Students who complete the Undergraduate UMass Boston GSSP will earn between 27-30 credits toward their bachelor's degree at UMass Boston.

Program duration

Students may complete the Undergraduate UMass Boston GSSP in two, three or four semesters, depending on their academic and English language entry credentials and ability to successfully complete the academic requirements. All incoming students will be required to take English and Mathematics placement tests to determine their initial schedule.

English Language Program (ELP)

The ELP program is designed to help students improve their English language proficiency and prepare them for entry into UMass Boston GSSP. Classes are five days a week for a total of 20 hours.

Honors College track

UMass Boston's Honors College presents a great opportunity for academically ambitious and motivated students. In the Honors College, students will take 18-21 credits, which meet general education requirements for degree completion. UMass Boston GSSP applicants should earn a cumulative 3.7 GPA or equivalent in high school, or have a minimum of 3.4 GPA and no grades lower than B upon completion of their first semester at UMass Boston to be considered for the Honors College.

ENGLISH, MATH SKILLS AND ACADEMIC WRITING SUPPORT

The UMass Boston Global Student Success Program (GSSP) offers support courses to help improve students' skills in English grammar, critical reading, academic writing, effective listening, discussions and note-taking. Additionally, UMass Boston GSSP offers regularly scheduled math support tutorials to assist with math studies in a structured learning environment.

ADVISING AND GUIDANCE

Adjusting to a new environment can be a stressful experience for some students. The UMass Boston GSSP staff provides students with individual attention and personal support in their academic, social and personal life. Students also have access to UMass Boston's medical and counseling services.

INTEGRATED LEARNING SKILLS

The Integrated Learning Skills course provides students with the necessary skills to succeed in university studies and to help students adjust to the university and surrounding community. This course is compulsory for all undergraduate UMass Boston GSSP students.

Scholarships and bursaries

GLOBAL STUDENT SUCCESS AWARD OF EXCELLENCE

UMass Boston GSSP provides a limited number of merit-based scholarships each semester to continuing students who maintain their enrollment in UMass Boston GSSP.

Scholarship applicants must demonstrate academic excellence and commitment to fostering intercultural understanding through their active engagement within the university community to be eligible.

FAMILY BURSARIES

UMass Boston GSSP offers financial support in the form of family bursaries. A bursary applies where two or more students from the same family study with a member institution.*

The bursary is equivalent to 10 percent of the tuition fee of your program of study.†



HEALTH INSURANCE

In accordance with the Commonwealth of Massachusetts Qualifying Student Health Insurance Program, all UMass Boston GSSP students must carry health insurance. Therefore, if you do not have health insurance under another plan with comparable (equal or better) coverage, you must join the UMass Boston Student Health Insurance Plan.

Please note that the following items do not meet the state's criteria for comparable insurance coverage:

- foreign (international) health insurance
- Uncompensated Care Pool (free care)

ADDITIONAL COSTS

In addition to your tuition and other fees, you will need approximately US\$15,000 to US\$17,000 to meet your living expenses each year. Typical expenses include accommodations, meals, books, stationery, transportation, utilities, telecommunications, recreation and entertainment. These will vary according to your individual requirements. Please remember that living in a metropolitan area might make it tempting for you to spend more, so you should plan your expenses according to your budget.
